

Residency training in abortion



Number of Abortion Providers

WHY?



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Methods

- Ob-Gyn graduates 1996-2001 (n=30):
 - 4 Residencies with routine abortion training

West (9)

Midwest (9)

South (5)

Northeast (7)

Supplementary interviews (n=10):

Residency Directors, Fellows, Administrators



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Barriers to Integrating FP

Violence, harassment, stigma are only part of the story

Barriers within medical settings

Institutional and group practice policies

Intimidation by superiors

Lack of staff support

Logistical and economic disincentives
